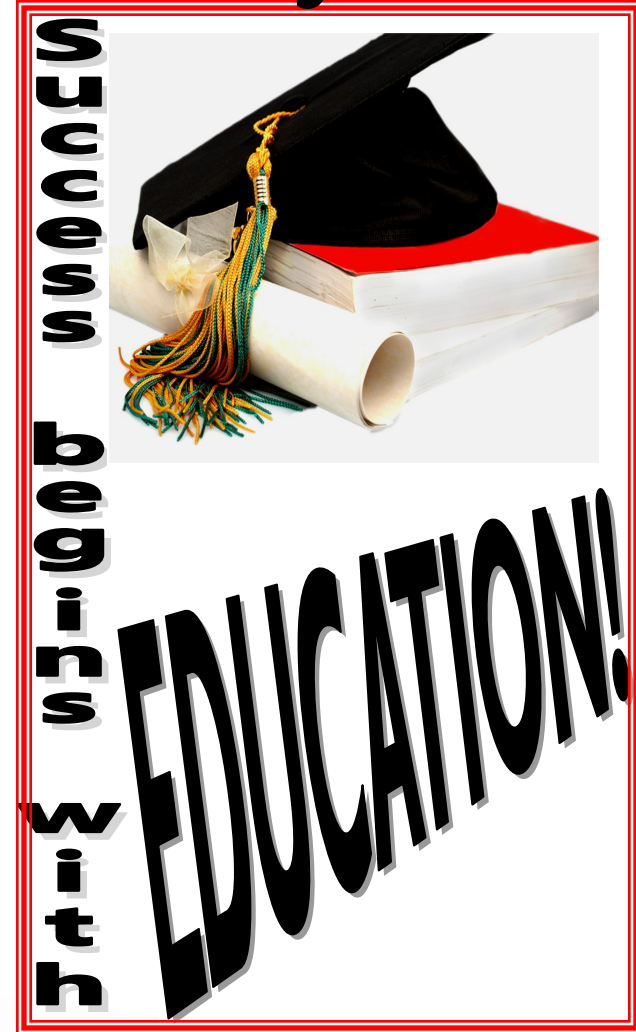

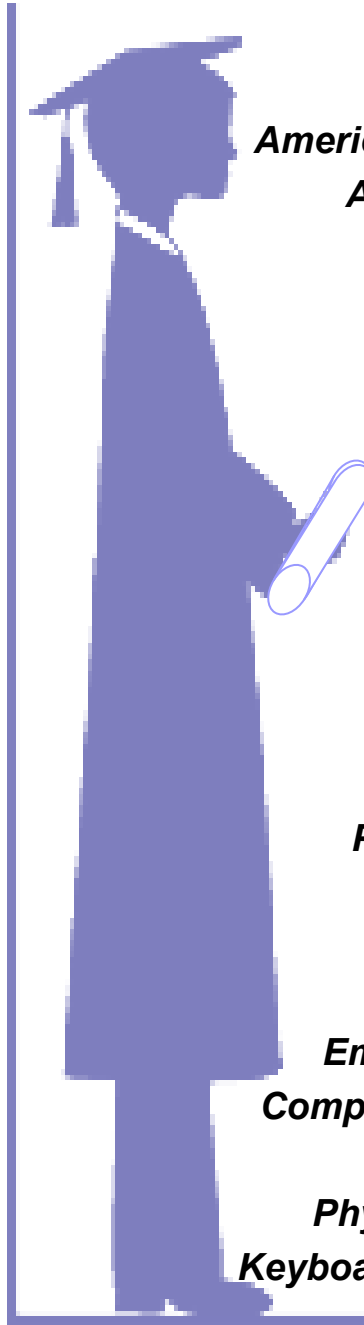
How We Can Help

- Just because you don't have a diploma is no reason you can't get one now! **These classes are FREE and the computer fee is only \$10.**
- The Adult Diploma Program is for people 18 or older who want to receive a high school diploma, **this is not a GED, it is an official high school diploma!**
- Students will complete academic curriculum using computer-based course instruction and applications supplied by the Diploma Program.
- You can work at your own pace and come in when it is convenient for you, so if you have a job or other obligations, you can still work on your diploma!

How long will it take to complete my course?

Each student will advance at his or her own pace with a teacher available for assistance. Hours are flexible, you can attend class in the morning, afternoon, or evening.

- You can also access the classes via the internet and work at home as well. This frees your time so you can remain employed while earning your diploma.
- The length of time to receive your diploma depends on the number of credits you need. A highly motivated student can complete courses in much less time because the instruction is highly focused and the student may spend as much time on a given subject per day as he or she prefers.
- Upon completion of all required credits, you will be issued a High School Diploma from your area school district.
