e4E Professional Learning (KSDE REQUIRED)

Suicide Prevention (KSDE REQUIRED)

In 2016, Kansas Legislature passed SB 323, known as the Jason Flatt Youth Suicide Awareness Act. Required programming shall include **annual training for all staff each calendar year** based on programs approved by the State Board of Education.

Southwest Plains will provide a training program, including:

- Video access to 3-part series
- Facilitator guide with embedded, interactive discussion prompts
- Sample debriefing activities

Staff and/or community stakeholders experience the daily, urgent stressors of living in poverty for a month in a simulated event. Participants achieve a set of goals based on the monthly income of a family in poverty by role-playing a family member or community resource provider. Orientation discussion gives participants facts about poverty and their assigned roles. Following the simulation, participants self-reflect by identifying individual and community challenges, thereby allowing them to implement a call-to-action in their own lives and professional practice. Minimum of 50, maximum of 100 participants

Pricing for Poverty Simulation

- Full day rate for members: \$1,000 plus applicable travel expenses

- Workshop Format for required Mentor Training PRIOR to school* - Includes one 1-day workshop plus virtual support throughout the year. Workshop training will take place on August 2, 2019, at SWPRSC Conference Center, Sublette.
- Virtual Format for required Mentor Training PRIOR to school* - Includes ONLY virtual learning modules (videos and response questions) for district mentors. (\$300 per mentor).

***Annual training is required each year for each mentor:** Southwest Plains has a virtual “refresher” course for mentors who have successfully completed one year as a mentor through our program. STUDENT SUPPORT

STEAM Camp for Students (On-site or camps at Southwest Plains)

Students (K-2, 3-6) engage in half day, hands-on STEAM experiences. During their camp, students rotate through engaging, hands-on, project-based centers to practice coding skills, math and problem-solving skills, and building simple machines.

Two, half-day programs are delivered directly to your students: one session for K - 2nd; the other session for students 3rd - 5th.

Pricing for Student STEAM Camp

- Dependent on camp specifics, including the number of students, parents, and staff members involved.
 - Example: \$1,200 per day (plus applicable travel expenses for on-site camps) for two half-day camps, 50 students maximum per session; local volunteers required.

Notes:

- Larger number of students cost more due to the increased cost of supplies, and potentially, Southwest Plains staff. More than 50 students per session also requires additional local adult volunteers to assist with activities.
- STEAM camps require a large space that can accommodate the number of students and the hands-on activities.
- If preferred, STEAM camp can be held for individual schools at the SWPRSC Conference Center in Sublette for an additional facility fee.

Redesigning for a Culture of STEAM (workshop at Southwest Plains)

Teams of teachers attend a workshop devoted to teachers training to become a local STEAM Leadership Team charged with sparking a STEAM revolution in their buildings or district. During this training, teachers explore STEAM learning in the classroom and practice a variety of hands-on activities appropriate for deployment locally. This training will culminate in an onsite STEAM Camp for your students led by the STEAM Leadership Team and Southwest Plains consultant.

Pricing for STEAM workshop
